Environmental aspects

- Controlling our environmental aspects and impacts
- Promotion of innovative medical and surgical equipment for patient care, with French and European suppliers accounting for over 70%
- Sustainable and responsible purchasing:
 - GAMIDA favours partners committed to an environmental approach
 - Reasonable and responsible selection of office consumables and equipment, packaging products and cleaning products
- Waste management based on the 3Rs model (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle):
 - Maintaining good practice in selective sorting and recycling of all waste materials
 - Encourage the reuse of cardboard rather than recycling by giving it a second life
- Targets to reduce waste production and energy and water consumption by 5% each year
- 100% of employees made aware of environmental issues and eco-actions

Social aspects

- Compliance with all employment regulations
- Fighting corruption and discrimination
- Taking account of the specific risks associated with certain workstations
- Promoting employee wellbeing
- Skills development throughout careers

Economic aspects

- Give preference to suppliers and partners who share our values in terms of sustainability and ethics
- Implement internal control mechanisms to ensure compliance with financial and ethical standards
- Investing in the ongoing training of our employees to develop their skills and promote their long-term employability

Governance aspects

- We regularly carry out internal and external audits to ensure that our commitments are being met, and we adopt our practices on the basis of the results obtained.
- Ensure transparent and ethical governance, in compliance with local and international regulations (such as the European MDR regulation).
- Ensuring the safety of patients and users of medical devices.
- Commitment to responding to the concerns and suggestions submitted to us

We constantly monitor changes in legislation to ensure that they are in line with our CSR policy.
